# LETTER FROM THE CEO

As 2021 draws to a close and we reflect on the year that has been, I think it's safe to say that none of us expected that the Covid-19 pandemic would continue to have such an impact on our way of life, particularly as Tenterfield has remained relatively unaffected. As an organisation, we have had to rapidly adapt to the challenges facing our everyday operations. Since the pandemic first impacted residential aged care in 2020, our priority at all times has been the safety of our residents, and every decision made has been with their welfare first and foremost. The hardest decision we have had to make is to physically keep residents and families apart during periods of lockdown. That decision was based on Health directives and taken out of our hands altogether with the enactment of Public Health Orders to control the risk to the public.

I am proud of the way in which our Management Team and staff have stood together, and stood firm, on the decisions we have made that have kept our residents safe. We have become more resilient as an organisation and have found new and creative ways to ensure our residents remain active and connected to families, friends, and each other. We are now more aware than ever of the importance of family, our loved ones, and our co-workers, and that we can get through anything together.

I thank you all for your patience, understanding, and support through 2021, and wish you a safe and happy festive season with your loved ones.

#### YEAR TO DATE

Whilst 2021 has been a challenging year, Tenterfield Care Centre (TCC) has also seen some outstanding achievements operationally.

Our greatest achievement this year has been the successful application for funding through the 2020 Aged Care Approvals Round. TCC was allocated \$2.5M towards the construction of a 28-bed extension to Haddington Nursing Home. Thank you to the Management Team for the time and effort that went into the application process, and congratulations on a fantastic outcome.

TCC is one of the largest employers in Tenterfield, and our staff remain our most important asset. Two staff members have successfully completed traineeships this year, one in Business Administration, and the other in Leisure and Health, which has greatly benefited the organisation.

TCC is currently sponsoring two staff through a Diploma of Nursing with TAFE NSW and will be assisting more staff to upskill in their chosen field in the coming year. Due to the current shortage of Registered Nurses across the aged care industry, TCC are sponsoring two overseas nurses who will commence early in the New Year.

TCC has also recently employed a marketing officer to ensure the community is kept well informed of our operations in a timely manner.

Due to the number of infrastructure projects scheduled for this year, TCC employed a qualified maintenance manager who has overseen a number of large projects to completion. These include the following:

- Finalisation of Millrace bedroom and ensuite refurbishment;
- Installation of air conditioning throughout both Millrace and Haddington;
- The replacement of the diesel boilers at Millrace with gas boilers;

The installation of automatic doors at both facilities for increased resident/staff security.

Construction of Stage 3 of Haddington Nursing Home is set to commence early in 2022, and the refurbishment of Millrace communal areas will continue.

Despite lockdowns and visiting restrictions, and in the absence of volunteers, our activities staff have continued to provide a wide range of activities throughout the year to ensure that our residents remain socially connected. Along with a range of art, craft, concerts, ensuring resident safety at all times. 2022 looks set to be just as challenging, however, TCC remain committed to providing quality care for our residents in Haddington and Millrace.
